

Our Christmas season comes to an end with our celebration of the Baptism of Jesus. No matter how many times I hear or read the various Evangelists' version of the Baptism narrative I am always struck with the words spoken by God immediately after Jesus was baptized: *You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased.* 

Imagine for a few moments some of the most challenging things you have ever done. Picture the surroundings. What did it look like or smell like? Do

you remember any particular sounds? Was anyone present with you? What were you feeling—frightened, exhilarated, nervous, relieved? Did anyone say anything to you? Can you recall their words?

Some of you are parents...do you remember the encouragement you received when you welcomed your first child into your home? Think back to when you were a child...can you remember who was there shouting support when you *finally* learned to ride a two-wheeler without training wheels? Does anyone recollect some of the congratulatory remarks made when you landed your first "real" job?

I've not met a person yet who does not like compliments, words of encouragement, or the proverbial "pat on the back." We thrive best when the good things we do are noticed. Jesus, I imagine, was no different. Here is a man who goes to John to be baptized in the Jordan River. The type of baptism John was giving was one of repentance; surely Jesus did not need to have sins washed clean. Yet, in his desire to be one with us, Jesus wants to be baptized. Now, the pivotal sentence in this Gospel is: "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased." WOW!! The baptism of Jesus is a story of God's encouragement and support. That same God who spoke from the heavens at that moment is the same God who speaks to us, "You are my beloved children with whom I am well pleased." Maybe God speaks to us through the love of our partners or children, through the kind actions of friends or even though the compassion of strangers.

The challenge for us, I believe, is to always act in ways that will be pleasing to God. This is no short order in today's world; in fact, it seems that our society makes it easier for us to be faith*less* children instead of faith*ful* children. Fortunately, we have each other to lean on, to pray with, and to call on for support. For this, we should be incredibly thankful.

As we continue in our individual faith journeys I invite you to reflect on how faithful you are to your own baptismal covenant—are you doing everything you can to be one of God's beloved kids?
