Fifteen years ago this month, our nation suffered a senseless and horrific attack. With the exception of the youngest among us, I am sure we all remember where we were, what we were doing, and what we were felling as the events of that day began to unfold before us. Fifteen years later, we continue to pray and remember...

**We Remember...**8:45a.m., September 11, 2001. American Airlines Flight 11 crashes into the north tower of the World

Trade Center. There is a cavernous hole and the building is afire.

**We Remember...**9:03a.m., September 11, 2001. United Airlines Flight 175 crashes into the south tower of the World Trade Center. The plane explodes and this building, too, is afire.

**We Remember...**9:43a.m., September 11, 2001. American Airlines Flight 77 crashes into the Pentagon. There is immediate smoke and fire.

**We Remember...**10:10a.m., September 11, 2001. United Airlines Flight 93 crashes in a lonely field near Shanksville, Pennsylvania. There is smoke, fire, and a gaping hole in the ground.

### We Remember...

- 265 on the four planes who died
- † 2606 in the World Trade Center and on the ground who died
- † 125 at the Pentagon who died
- † 343 New York City Fire Department firefighters who died
- † 71 Law Enforcement officers who died
- † 37 Port Authority police officers who died

We cannot help but to have heard or read the stories of a number of the individuals who perished that day. There is one, in particular, which I would like to briefly share—Fr. Mychal Judge, OFM. Mychal was a Franciscan priest who was also a FDNY chaplain. He often accompanied firefighters on runs and September 11, 2001 was no different.

On this day, he immediately began administering Last Rights to a firefighter. He then went back into the lobby of the north tower and was killed by falling material inside when the south tower collapsed.

Somehow, Fr. Mychal's body was transported to St. Peter's church and laid upon the altar. Fr. Mychal Judge was issued death certificate number 00001— his was the first body to be recovered and taken to the medical examiner. The icon on the upper left of the previous page bears his image. There is a prayer that Fr. Mychal began each day with and, as we remember the victims of September 11, 2001, it is one I would like to share with you.

Lord, take me where you want me to go;

Let me meet who you want me to meet;

Tell me what you want me to say

And keep me out of your way.


