I thought of my son, Liam, as I read the words from the Epistle of James that we will hear on Sunday, September 13, the 24<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time. What struck me most in

that reading are the words I have bolded.

What good is it, my brothers and sisters, if someone says he has faith but does not have works?

Can that faith save him?

If a brother or sister has nothing to wear and has no food for the day, and one of you says to them, "Go in peace, keep warm, and eat well," but you do not give them the necessities of the body, what good is it?

So also faith of itself, if it does not have works, is dead.

We have always tried to impress on Liam the importance of helping others in tangible ways. For a number of years he collected empty pop cans and bottles and used the money to buy toys for the kids at Children's Hospital. As part of his current religious education program, every family is asked to do a family service project, and so this year we made "Blessing Bags." Michelle saw the idea for this on Pinterest and thought that it would be a good project for us. A Blessing Bag is simply a plastic Ziploc type bag filled with toiletries and nonperishables that you keep in your car to give to the homeless person you may encounter on the corner as you travel about.

The bags we made up contain water, breakfast bars/biscuits, apple sauce, cheese and crackers, pretzels, lifesavers, mints, peanut butter, trail mix, first aid kit, tissues, notepad and pen, antibacterial wipes, plastic spoons, and napkins. Additionally, we've included a note of encouragement and a list of social service agencies in Oakland and Wayne counties.

As a community we do a lot to help those less fortunate than ourselves and I know that the recipients of our good will are appreciative. All this being said and with Council's approval, we will have a Dignity Service Project and make up some blessing bags to keep in our cars. There will be a sheet in the foyer during the after-mass social for you to place your name next to any items you can donate. After all the necessary items are collected we will, as a community, create our own assembly line after mass and put all the donations together in the Blessing Bags. Then you will all be invited to take a couple of them to distribute to the person in need. **Our goal...100 Blessing Bags!** 

As we continue our ministry to our disadvantaged sisters and brothers, pray that God will use us to be a blessing for others. Please watch for the sign-up sheet in the foyer, and if you have any questions please don't hesitate to ask me.


